Epiphany

Epiphany comes from the Greek word epiphania, which means manifestation. In the early church Epiphany was a major celebration, more important than even Christmas or the birth of Christ and ranking second only to Easter. Three "manifestations" are often celebrated as we will on the charge this year. 1) The visit of the Magi January 2; 2) The baptism of the Lord January 9; 3) Transfiguration Sunday February 27.

Christmas Season

Christmas is a season of praise and thanksgiving for the incarnation of God in Jesus Christ; beginning Christmas Eve and continuing through the day of Epiphany January 6. (The 12 Days of Christmas!) Epiphany is generally celebrated on January 6 or the Sunday prior.
